During the Month of Russian-American Venture Industry Cooperation, a Russian delegation of government and industry executives will participate in a number of venture capital business events and learn about the U.S. venture industry. Events will include World Venture Summit “Capital for International Innovation”, September 27-28, 2005, National Association of Seed and Venture Funds Annual Conference “Fostering Innovation Capital”, September 28-30, 2005, Mid-Atlantic Venture Conference, October 17-18, 2005, and OutsourceWorld New York, October 18-19, 2005.

The most important event of the month will be Russian participation in the Mid-Atlantic Venture Conference (MAVC), organized by MARBC. MAVC showcases the best young companies of the region and provides companies with incomparable exposure to the region's top venture capitalists and private equity investors. Notably, MAVC features a technology track, presenting IT, nanotechnology, telecommunications, and other technology related companies. Planning Underway for 3rd RANIT in November

Based on the remarkable success of the inaugural RANIT, and the evident potential for tremendous growth of this undertaking, the decision was made to expand the event and make it semi-annual. The 3rd Semi-Annual Russian-American Innovation Technology Week will open on November 7, 2005 at the National Constitution Center in Philadelphia. RANIT activities will include numerous round table seminars and panel discussions. In addition, MARBC will organize Russian participation at the ITEC Conference in Valley Forge, PA from November 9-10, one of a prominent series of regional IT trade shows which bring together IT and business professionals.

One of the major themes of the 3rd Semi-Annual Russian-American Innovation Technology week will be technology in education. The week will present multiple opportunities for furthering communication and cooperation between Russian and American universities, including a roundtable discussion with directors of technology transfer programs at Philadelphia area universities. Representatives from various Russian universities will arrive to participate in RANIT, including a 40- member [delegation of students and faculty from a MESI](#), a leading university in Russia in the field of distance education and e-learning. Several

panels and a roundtable discussion will also be held at the International Incubator in the University City Science Center and in the International House.

Alternative energy technology represents another major theme for the week, with events including a roundtable with the Deputy Secretary for the Office of Energy and Technology Development of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. Other leading themes will include biotechnology, robotics, and safety and security technologies.

40-Member Delegation from Leading Russian University to Arrive in Philadelphia in November

MARBC is delighted to announce the arrival in November of a delegation of faculty, students, and administrators from Moscow State University of Economics, Statistics, and Informatics (MESI). The leadership of the 40-member delegation includes the first-vice president of the university and the head of the international department. Representatives of diverse aspects of the university from a mathematics professor, to a tennis team captain, to a student theater group will also be part of the delegation. Their visit will be an opportunity to connect with regional universities, not only on an official level, but also through informal contacts among the students.

Moscow State University of Economics, Statistics and Informatics (MESI) is one of the leading universities in Russia, offering undergraduate and graduate degree programs in economics, information systems, statistics, management, and business administration. MESI was also one of the pioneer universities in Russia in the introduction of distance education systems to the study process and maintains its leadership in usage of e-learning technologies. 150,000 regional students participate in the MESI Open and Distant Education system.

The MESI delegation visit will take place within the framework of the 3rd Semi-Annual Russian-American Innovation Technology Week (RANIT) to be held from November 7-15, 2006. The MESI delegation will participate in a variety of events focused on furthering communication and cooperation between Russian and American universities, including meetings at Temple University, a roundtable with directors of technology transfer programs at Philadelphia area universities, and the week's concluding event at the International Incubator in the University City Science Center.

The 5th Biennial Mid-Atlantic - Russia Business Opportunities Symposium "Ten Years After – Russian-American Business Opportunities"

This year the 5th Biennial Mid-Atlantic – Russia Business Opportunities Symposium marks the 10th anniversary of the MARBC's first full scale event. Since 1995, the Symposium has been the region's only major biennial event dedicated to promoting business opportunities with Russia and the Newly Independent States, as has received support from Mid-Atlantic state and local governments, economic development organizations, and regional chambers of commerce and business associations.

This year's distinguished speakers include representatives from the U.S. Department of Commerce, the Mid-Atlantic States' Departments of Commerce, Community and Economic Development, U.S. Congressmen, and senior executives from American companies doing business with Russia. The keynote address will be given by United States Congressman Curt Weldon of Pennsylvania, Congressional point person on communications with the Russian Government, Chairman of the Russian Duma-U.S. Congress Study Group.

Events in Russia:

XI Moscow Industrial Trade-Fair

The XI Moscow Industrial Trade-Fair, to be held from August 30- September 2, is one of the central events organized around the celebration of City Day in Moscow. The exhibition, directed towards the promotion of national industrial production and technology in the Russian market, has an interregional character. The events promote new business contacts, increased economic linkages, and coordination between the regions and the capital.

Within the framework of the exhibition, a large number of business programs will take place with the participation of directors and specialists of the federal, Moscow city, and Moscow oblast levels of government.

The Moscow Association of Entrepreneurs will organize a roundtable in the business program portion of the trade fair on "Bank investment in Industry and High Technology: Experience and Problems." Speakers will address various topics related to investment in scientific projects, such as the role played by publication in scientific journals, and the problem of expert evaluation of high technology projects. Val Kogan, president of the Mid-Atlantic – Russia Business Council, will address attracting investment from the United States in science and technology projects. Within the framework of round table, exhibitions by the winners of the innovation competition "Leader in the Field of High Technology," an annual contest held of the Moscow Entrepreneurs Association and the government of Moscow, and co-organized by the MARBC, will be unfolded. Guests at the round table will include previous years' winners of the innovation Competition "Leader in the Field of High Technology," scientists, directors of innovation enterprises and organizations participating in the process of developing innovation, financial organizations, representatives of various levels of legislative and executive power, and members of the Moscow Association of Entrepreneurs.

Regarding other events in the business program, the main thematic division will be a conference on “Moscow City Procurement” devoted to familiarizing businesses with city procurement procedures, and exchanging information between regional suppliers and the organizers of government competitions and auctions. Other notable events will be roundtables on “Protecting the rights of consumers and development of events on the struggle against counterfactual and falsified output figures” and “Protection of Intellectual Property,” and the annual inter-regional conference “The experience of Moscow and Russian regions in the support of national production.” The Federal Department of State Services will also hold a “Fair of Vacancies” during the exhibition, in which more than 20 organizations participated last year. The trade fair will be covered widely in both city-wide and national news media.

Robotics 2005

The 3rd International Specialized Exhibition “Robotics 2005,” will be held October 18-21 in Moscow, Russia. Robotics 2005 is major international exhibition designed to present the hi-tech, robotics, intelligent and mechatronic systems developed and used in Russia, and to select innovative projects to introduce to the world market of high-tech production. Exhibition participants include industrial enterprises, educational and research institutions, and media and publishing houses specialized in the field of robotics. Innovative work will also be presented by small businesses and by students. Themes for the exhibition include: robotics, intelligent consumer goods, artificial intelligence, industrial electronics, specialized industrial computing systems, integrated robotic and mechatronic systems, nanotechnologies, optical recognition systems, measuring devices and observing systems, data transmission systems, and power supply systems and sources.

The exhibition is carried out within the framework of Russian Technological Seasons -2005. The exhibition organizers include the Federal Agency for Science and Innovation of Russia, the Russian Academy of Sciences, the State Research Center of Russia Central R&D Institute of Robotics and Technical Cybernetics, FRCEC, and “EXPODESIGN” Russian Exhibition Company. MARBC will be organizing American participation in the event.

Security and Safety Technologies XI International Forum & Exhibition

The International Forum “Security and Safety Technologies, ” to be held February 7-10, 2006 in Moscow, Russia, is the industry’s foremost exhibition and congress event, serving the security market in the territory of Russia, the CIS and Eastern Europe. The Forum successfully combines the largest specialized exhibition of technical security facilities and services with a broad-scaled congress program.

The Russian security industry today is a fast growing market with a \$4.5 billion annual revenue for security products and over 1500 companies. Exhibitors and participants in the congress program are Russian and foreign companies involved with the manufacturing and installation of security systems and equipment, state legislative and executive authorities, heads of entrepreneur companies, and associations of non-state security agencies, among others. The Forum attracts an audience of more than 28,000 trade visitors from 40 countries, with more than 80% of them decision makers and two-thirds CEOs. National pavilions of the USA, Germany, Korea, Taiwan will be present. Last year, representatives from 20 American companies and government

organizations participated as exhibitors. The Mid-Atlantic Russian Business Council is currently leading the organization of the U.S. Pavilion for the XI International Forum.

Bolshoi Ballet to Perform “Spartacus” in Philadelphia
